The Seller shall not be held responsible for any warping splitting and cracking of solids and polish or any other corrosion, resulting from abnormal conditions existing in the environment, such as humidity, excessive heat, dampness etc. Save for the above, the Seller guarantees the workmanship and material within the limits prescribed by law. Fittings and fabrics are not covered by any form of Guarantee.

Warranty is subject to adherence to the maintenance-cleaning instructions provided overleaf. Warranty does not cover damage due improper usage, attempted burglary, non-recommended cleaning/maintenance or damage due to extreme weather conditions.

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All products are covered against manufacturing defect (i.e. a flaw in the product design, materials or workmanship that causes the product to no longer function). Products have a limited warranty period, as follows.

- 10 years on White Koemmerling and KBE uPVC Profiles, on UPVC Gaskets and Double-Glazing Insulation.
- 8 years on Hardware of exterior apertures excluding Handles.
- 5 years on Coloured Koemmerling and KBE UPVC Profiles.
- 5 years on White or Coloured Aluminium Profile in Schuco and Elvial.
- 2 years on Blinds, External Shading Products including Awnings, Motors, Gates, Railings, Fences & Internal Doors
- 1 year on labour for any product.

MAINTENANCE-CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS

uPVC, Aluminium

To ensure long lasting quality frames by the manufacturer, you should periodically (at least every six months) maintain the following parts:

- Fittings/Mechanisms - Hinges: All mobile points of the frame (opening or projected) including the hinges should be lubricated every six (6) months with silicone spray or silicone grease.
- Gaskets: should be sprayed too and wiped with a clean cloth at least once a year.
- Profiles: Should be cleaned with fresh water using a soft cloth (not wire or scouring pads) at least twice a year to remove dust and other particles, especially in the corners.

CAUTION!!!

DO NOT attempt any type of cleaning on the frames with mineral products, oils, joint grease, gasoline and/or solvents. There is a risk of damaging the profiles and the gaskets. For specific types of dirt (such as pencil markings, asphalt, watercolors, pens, fuel oil, PVC glue, normal type of glue, lacquer with nitrate, wax crayons, oil based lacquer, etc) refer to the manufacturer without compromising durability and appearance of your frames.

DO NOT rub the profiles with sandpaper, wire, metal brushes, metal scrapers, or blades. This may cause irreparable damage to the materials. It is also prohibited to attempt any type of cleaning with the above materials to the window glazing systems.

DO NOT clean the profiles with pressure washers or a garden hose. There is danger of overflowing the sinks of the profile which may result to permanent moisture at the bottom of the window glazing system and affect double glass insulation.

DO NOT glue any type of paper tape or other tape on the surface of the profiles.

DO remove the protective film of the frames once the aperture is installed and/or less than two months from the date of delivery of the goods. The protective film will become permanent in extreme heat or if left more than two months and will cause damage to the profile to scrape it off.



Taking Care of your Internal Doors & Handles

- Regular dusting - Even in the cleanest of homes, it is not uncommon for dust to build up. Feather dusters are great for this, however they can't always reach into tight gaps to combat the dust, so it is best to use a clean paintbrush to get into those hard-to-reach areas – and get a thorough clean.
- A light wash - Doors do not require heavy cleaning, most stains can easily be removed with light wash down with a damp cloth or non abrasive sponge. Always ensure that the door is properly dry after cleaning with a soft cloth.
- Door handles are naturally one of the dirtiest parts of a door, due to the amount of hands that come into contact with them. It is important to get rid of any bacteria that may be built up on door handles by cleaning the fittings with a sanitising cloth. This should be done regularly to safeguard the longevity of the handle.
- Washing of floors - Avoid throwing an excessive amount of water around the door whilst washing the floors. Remember that wood being a natural product absorbs water therefore too much water will eventually damage the door and/or frames in the long run.
- Ventilation - It is important that your home is kept well ventilated throughout the year. Handles even if made of stainless steel will corrode if the property is not properly ventilated.
